# Youth Competence: Considerations for Juvenile Defenders

# The Competence LEGAL STANDARD

- o Does the state apply *Dusky?*
- Does the law include "rationality"
- Are there youth specific factors (like immaturity)?
- o Are there definitions?
- Are there cases or rules?



# The Competence EVALUATION

- o Is there a set timeframe for the evaluation/report?
- Must it occur in the least restrictive setting?
- Are there minimum qualifications for the examiner?
- What is the examiner expected to provide in the report?



# The Competence PROCEDURE

- O Who can raise the issue?
- o Is there a presumption (competent or incompetent)?
- O Who has the burden of proof?
- O What is the standard of proof?
- O Are there protections against self-incrimination?
- What happens upon a finding of incompetence?!

### <sup>†</sup> The Prevailing Legal Test

#### Common Law 2 Part Standard

Whether the individual by reason of mental disease or disorder is unable at the time of plea or trial to:

- a) Understand the nature and purpose of the proceedings, or
- b) Consult and cooperate with counsel in preparing and presenting the defense.



#### Understanding of

- The nature and seriousness of the charges;
- Purpose of a trial & possible consequences;
- Pleas and the nature of plea agreements; &
- The role of various participants in the court process (e.g., defense counsel, prosecutor, judge, the youth herself as the defendant).

# Communication Skills (receptive and expressive)

- Ability to comprehend the defender's questions and inquiries;
- Ability to discern what information is relevant to the defender's questions; and
- Ability to articulate the relevant information related to the defender's questions.

#### **Decision-making and Planning Skills**

- Ability to appreciate time
- · Ability to appreciate or weigh likely outcomes
- Ability to consider the evidence
- Ability to understand the rights they will relinquish to enter a plea

#### **Trial Skills**

- Endure the stress of trial;
- Maintain demeanor;
- · Testify relevantly, if necessary; and
- Follow the flow of the proceedings.
